The legal voters of the Town of Clarendon, Vt. and the Town School District met as above warned on March 1, 1971 and acted upon the following Articles as follows:

Meeting was called to order and due to the resignation of Edward Congdon as moderator we had to elect a moderator pro-tem. George Holden, nominated, seconded, and Town Votes yes by acclamation to have George Holden as moderator.

Town School Warning read, also Town Warning read. Results as follows:

Article 1. Report of Town Officers accepted by acclamation.

Article 2. The vote by Australian Ballot on March 2, 1971, for the Election of necessary officers, was as follows:

- Article 6. Town voted by acclamation to pay taxes to Town Treasurer.
- Article 7. Town voted by acclamation to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for temporary use of the Town.
- Article 8. Town voted Yes by acclamation to authorize the Selectmen to purchase land for a municipal forest. (Minimum 40 Acres.)
- Article 9. \$2,500.00 for Fire Association—Yes 237—No 47.
- Article 10. General Tax of \$1.80—Yes 189—No 89.
- Article 11. Sum of money for Expenses of General Fund for 1972. Article voted down because of tie vote, Yes—135—No 135.
- Article 12. To transact other business—

Motion made to publish list of delinquent tax payers and amount of Taxes as of December 31, 1971, motion seconded and carried by acclamation.

Motion made that commencing October 1, 1971, shall interest be charged on delinquent taxes at the rate of $\frac{1}{2}\%$ per month or fraction thereof. Motion seconded and voted Yes by acclamation.

Motion made to empower Selectmen to call a public meeting sometime between January 21st and January 31st 1972 for necessary discussion and corrections of Warning before printing in Town Report. Motion seconded and voted Yes by acclamation.

Motion made and seconded that Mr. Danaro as a Town Tax payer could be heard on his discussion of his listing. Voted Yes by acclamation and so done.

Motion made that Meeting be recessed until 12:00 o'clock noon on March 2, 1971, — seconded.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL DIRECTORS AND THE SUPERINTENDENT

The elementary school is now well into the second year of occupancy. The enrollment continues to increase and numbers over the three hundred mark at the present time.

The program also continues to develop as teachers and pupils begin to explore the possibilities of open space and individual instruction. Several staff members were able to enroll in a University of Vermont workshop held at the school last summer on the use of open space. The staff is now engaged in planning and working out the best ways of providing the children of Clarendon with the type of education they need and require.

The continuing increase in pupils is also reflected in the costs of operation of the system. More teachers are needed for the staff and it is planned to add two more in the coming year.

The other large expense in the budget is tuition for high school. With an eighth grade of thirty graduating in June, there will be approximately ninety-one Clarendon boys and girls attending Rutland High School, eleven at West Rutland, and three at Wallingford. The total of this secondary education is \$122,000.

The budget for the next fiscal year totals \$348,127.75. The large items are the tuition costs for our high school students, the salaries for our staff to handle the increasing numbers in the elementary school, and the payment on the elementary school.

Fortunately state aid for the Clarendon School District will continue to increase as it has the past few years. It will not increase as much as it should because the legislature is not appropriating enough funds to increase the per cent of State support.

The amount of local taxes needed for the schools for the next fiscal year is \$230,000.

This gives us a total of 2462 man hours for the year of 1971.

The two trucks in North Clarendon were used 44 hours fighting fires and the truck in Chippenhook 22 hours.

The Department participated in four parades in 1971, one of which was the Annual State Fire Convention in Brattleboro. At the State Convention we won six trophies, the Firemen one, and the Ladies Auxiliary five.

Our annual auction netted us a grand total of \$1,496.00. Our best auction thus far. If everyone would get their donations ready for us we will do our best to pick them up at any time they are available. We sincerely need your help in order to make this annual auction the success it has been in the past.

The Ladies Auxiliary has again added to the success of the Dept. by their endless efforts. Because of the enthusiasm and

cooperation between the Firemen and the Auxiliary the town has one of the most active and energetic Departments in the State.

In order that we may hold our status and give the town the protection that we have in the past we again ask your support of \$2500.00. REPORT ON REGIONAL PLANNING

It is a pleasure to submit this Report of the Rutland Regional Planning Commission. During 1971, the RRPC had a membership of 19 Communities in the Rutland Region. Clarendon is represented by Stuart Blacklock as Regular Commissioner and David Miller as Alternate. Meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month.

As one of 14 Regional Commissions in Vermont, the RRPC continued its functions of providing planning assistance, reviewing grant and development applications, providing technical help, assisting at committee, local planning commission and public hearings, giving secretarial and mimeographing services, coordinating with state and Federal agencies, speaking to groups, etc.

The year 1971 saw an increased emphasis on the planning process. Recently enacted environmental legislation has established a review procedure on most developments or subdivisions

and local input is required if communities are to maintain maximum local control. Ten RRPC member communities have now adopted plans and eighteen have some form of by-law control, partly through assistance of the RRPC. Plans and model regulations have been prepared for all members and a Regional Plan is being printed.

Despite cutbacks in Federal funding for Commission work, the RRPC continues to process grant applications and to conduct studies necessary for the availability of certain grant programs.

A successful course for local and regional planning officials and other interested persons was sponsored by the RRPC. Information on housing, solid waste, subdivision regulation, environmental laws, aerial photography, population projections, census data, etc., has been prepared or made available.

Cost of the planning program has been nominal and local members have been consistent in supporting this cost. State and Federal funds on a matching basis have been helpful in continuing the work of the RRPC to assist localities. May we take this opportunity to thank the members for their support, both financial and of their time. Planning is time-consuming and adopting of regulations frustrating but necessary if the communities are to profit from inevitable growth and change.

The coming year will test further the ability and determination of communities to control their futures. The RRPC stands ready to assist in these important efforts. We invite you to visit your office at 12 Wales Street.

VERMONT DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE

Dear Sir:

For the past three years this department, as a courtesy, has furnished to each town and city the amounts spent and people aided in each locality under the various Social Welfare programs. This information replaced the previous annual report to each town of the charges that had been assessed against their community for their share of State operated welfare programs. The enactment of the Social Welfare Act of 1967 eliminated sharing in State welfare costs at the local level and, as a result, the requirement for reporting to the towns.

There has been a partial decentralization to welfare districts of the public assistance check writing process in an effort to equalize workloads and to more promptly render help to needy Vermonters. The checks are manually issued in the district offices and do not generate machine readable data input necessary to the computer program which has supplied the tables furnished on a town basis in the past. Producing the statistics by manual tabulation could not be justified in view of the expense involved in State tax dollars. Accordingly, the information is not being furnished to you this year.

When the welfare system is computerized, the department will again be in a position to furnish each town with individual welfare statistics as an inexpensive by-product of essential operations for informational purposes.

The Home Health Services program, in addition to providing for the survey of home health agencies as required by Medicare,, works cooperatively with the Division of Public Health Nursing works closely with the Vermont Assembly of Home Health Agencies and the Agency of Human Services in seeking the provision of certified home health care available to all the people of the state.
